« Aid in dying: What can we learn from person-centered care and shared decision-making? »

Communication and decision-making regarding aid in dying are complex and challenging. Models of person-centeredness and decision-making in healthcare can enhance these processes. Person-centered care encompasses a range of dimensions, including recognizing each patient's uniqueness, empowering patients, engaging their loved ones, and ensuring access to care. Shared decision-making, considered the pinnacle of patient-centered care, means collaborative healthcare decision-making between patients and clinicians. Many elements of person-centered healthcare and shared decision-making are pertinent to aid in dying, though their limitations must also be acknowledged.

Dr. Pola Hahlweg's presentation aims to explore the intersections and distinctions among person-centered healthcare, shared decision-making, and aid in dying based on her theoretical considerations, empirical research, and clinical experience.
